Dear Parents/Carers,

What a term it has been, with so much excellent learning, such wonderful trips, including to Melsop Farm for Reception/Year One, to Hunstanton to the Sealife and RNLI centres for Y2/3 and to Castle Museum for Y4/5/6. We've had live music in school for the children to listen to and play, sporting competitions against other schools, sporting festivals at The Nicholas Hammond Academy, the Crucial Crew trip and event for Y6, Red Nose day, dressed up and celebrated World Book day with stories and activities, visitors coming in to do workshops, such as Online safety, Parents/Carers' Consultations, Parents/Carers' Cafes and Forums, and we finished off with our Easter events and Church Services this week. Phew!

Covering one of our classes whilst one of teachers was off recently reminded me what challenging, skilled and professional work teaching is, with hourly requirements to assess children, change your questioning accordingly, pitch the work differently as well as supporting children's emotional needs and remembering the little things that matter as well as working hard in the evenings to answer emails, communicate with people and plan and resource the following day's learning and events. Our staff do such a brilliant job and we are very lucky to have a team who invest so much into the children. A massive thanks also go to our Parents and Friends groups across the Federation for their various Easter events and to you all for supporting them. It has also been a difficult time recently across the Federation with the tragic and unexpected death of our colleague Paula Smith, a dedicated, skilled, compassionate and kind Teaching Assistant who always put others first. We have honoured her memory in various ways and are deeply grateful for all the messages of support we have had, so thank you.

Y4/5/6 Residential visits – Summer term;
