We have had a lot of fun this week with the water being a firm favourite in this hot weather! In English we have started to do a specific Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar lesson every Monday to complement and inform our independent writing every Friday. The writing is really showing progress and the children enjoy being able to write whatever they like about a given picture. This week, we have started our book called 'Man on the Moon (a day in the life of Bob) by Simon Bartram and the children have been busy discussing the structure of the story. They were especially excited about the aliens hiding from Bob! We will use this to write our own story as the character of Bob. In Maths we have been comparing numbers and partitioning them into tens and units in Year 1. In Reception, we have been looking at the properties of number and making pairs to find out if numbers are odd or even.
