We have also read about climate change and have produced an oil pastel picture depicting some of the possible effects of climate change. I have been really impressed with how hard all the children have worked and am really excited to work with them all in September. Parents/Carers' Termly Forum Feedback:

We held our Summer term Parents/Carers' Forum recently, at which everyone was happy and positive.

We discussed the Communication Strategy and keeping the Parent Forum termly. We felt that continuing with two questionnaires would work well. Parents/Carers feedback that getting text reminders was helpful, as were the dates on the newsletter. We also talked about Breakfast Club and trying to make space for ad hoc use, so the policy is now being re-written so that two spaces can be held for this; this will go through the necessary checks and should be in place for September.
