Dear Parents,

It seems an age since I last wrote the newsletter. I have missed being here and thank you all for your kind messages on my return. It was lovely to return on Tuesday and walk into classrooms to be met by smiling faces with some eager to show me their work and tell me how well they had been doing over the previous couple of weeks. It reminds me of what a special place Castle Acre truly is.

Clearly the staff and children have been working extremely hard in my absence. There is a beautiful display of rolling waves artwork in the corridor outside Whitebeam class. We are working hard this year to ensure that we reach the best attendance we can. **96%** is considered strong attendance and is so important for ensuring that your children learn and achieve well. **95% - considered satisfactory** attendance by the Government and Ofsted as well as us - means not missing any more than ten school days over the whole year.

Dates

Medicines.

We understand that there will be times when your child needs medication if they are poorly. Our policy is that where prescribed medications are concerned, we will administer them in accordance with the direction from the doctor. We also know that there are times your child may need medication that is not prescribed, such as paracetamol. We are happy to administer this medication but our policy states that we are only able to give one dose. If, after that does, your child's symptoms do not ease or improve then we will call you but we cannot administer any further doses. All medication must be handed into the school office and you will need to fill in a form. Medication must be in its original box or container. If you wish to see our policy for administering medicines it is available on the website or available from the school office.

We have continued to think about the Easter story in RE and created a cross using lots of different craft materials. In PE we have enjoyed learning lots of new skills including dribbling, attacking and defending. Well done Rowan class!

In maths we have looked at tally charts, pictograms and bar graphs and have interpreted the data by answering questions about them. In art we have now made the basis of our fish sculptures with the next step covering them in modroc! The class have been thinking about others as we celebrate Red Nose Day and Mothers' Day this week and in PSHE we have read and discussed the book Feelings by Richard Jones and Libby Walden. In RE we have been learning about Passover and the significance of the Seder plate and what the different foods symbolise. Well done Whitebeam.

In maths we have been looking at area and have considered how to calculate the area of compound shapes. In our DT learning, we built our own slingshot cars and will be testing out their streamline, strength and ability to travel far next week. In PE, we carried on our unit based on yoga and selected different poses to create our own yoga flows. As part of our history learning, we considered how different artefacts can be used as an historical source and give us information about an early civilisation. Of course, our history learning was really brought to life through our fantastic trip to Norwich Castle Museum where we took part in some fun activities relating to ancient civilisations. Well done to all of our children who engaged well and behaved beautifully during our trip out today.
