Dear Parents,

End KS2 SATS - next week

Next week is end of KS2 SATS week. We know our Year 6 children will be brilliant and will try their very best, which is all we can ever ask. Nevertheless, we wish them all the very best of luck. I think there is a little treat planned for you on the Friday after the final test.

Miss George will be in all week to administer the assessments with Mrs Bridgeman and I will be teaching the Year 4s and 5s on Tuesday and Wednesday morning while they do this.

End KS1 SATs - w/b 15/05/2023

Whilst these tests are not sat as formally as end of KS2, our Year 2 children still sit SATs paper and, along with teacher assessment, make up their final assessment score at the end of the key stage to show us what they can do, what they find tricky and how much progress they have made since the end of their Reception Year. We do not have to do these at a specific time, just as long as we complete them in May. We will be completing most of ours during the week beginning 15th May. Whilst we keep everything as informal as we can, it is really helpful if you can spend some time at home with your child practising their spellings, number bonds and times tables and reading with them daily. Year 4 Multiplication Tables Check

For the last few years, Year 4 have been required to complete a Multiplication Tables Check. This is a short test online and is to be completed between the 5th June and 16th June. Please encourage your child to practice their tables every night, the speedier the better! Thank you for your support and if you have any questions then please see Miss George or myself.

Attendance

We are really pleased with our attendance at the moment – we are always striving for 100% but anything 96% or above we are happy with. We thank you for all your support in keeping the children in school, especially as we have been battling the summer colds. It really does make a difference them being here!

Before the Easter holidays, we sent your child's attendance record home for this academic year. If you received a letter asking you to book an appointment to see Mrs Spaul, please call the school office and book this in.

Holidays

We thank you for working with us to book holidays out of term time. We completely understand the savings that can be made and know it can be really tempting, especially this time of year, to think that a few days out will not make any difference. However, there are lots of assessments that happen this term which help us and High Schools to tailor teaching for next year so your child can make the progress they are capable of. They will have to complete these regardless of whether they are here during the assessment period or not and it is much nicer for them to do them with their peers rather than when their peers are doing other projects. We also have lots of activities and events coming up that we know the children will love to be part of and it can be hard for them to hear their friends talk about these.

Please be aware that we will not be authorising any holidays during term time unless under special circumstances. Whilst we understand the rising costs of holidays and that there is a significant difference in cost between during school holiday and out of school holiday time, any time off has a significant impact on your child's education. Any holidays taken during term time are discussed with our attendance officer in our termly meetings.

Medicines.

We understand that there will be times when your child needs medication if they are poorly. Our policy is that where prescribed medications are concerned, we will administer them in accordance with the direction from the doctor. We also know that there are times your child may need medication that is not prescribed, such as paracetamol. We are happy to administer this medication but our policy states that we are only able to give one dose. If, after that does, your child's symptoms do not ease or improve then we will call you but we cannot administer any further doses. All medication must be handed into the school office and you will need to fill in a form. Medication must be in its original box or container. If you wish to see our policy for administering medicines it is available on the website or available from the school office.
