Dear Parents,

We have erected the large gazebo and it is beside the race track ready for Sports Day. You might wonder why this is worth mentioning but it takes a monumental effort every year to put it up. News from our Classes

Rowan

What a busy week in Rowan class, we have been doing lots of sports day practice which has been great fun!. The dressing up race is by far the favourite I am sure you will all agree. We have been amazed by the children's sportsmanship with each other, the perseverance, determination and confidence they have shown. In maths this week reception have been exploring different ways to double using dice, Numicon and using their hands. Year 1 has been comparing numbers to 100 by partitioning tens and ones. In science we have been learning about different types of weather we have in each season. Well done Rowan class!

Whitebeam

In Whitebeam Class this week the children have been continuing to plan their own journey adventure in English and have concentrated on character and setting descriptions. In maths the Y2 children have been learning about temperature (very topical or should I say tropical!) and the Y3 children have started their summer PiXL

assessments. In science we have looked at the major organs in the body and what they do and in music their playing in time to a piece of music on the glockenspiels is definitely improving. The children have also had the opportunity to research a topic of interest to them with a friend and have used the Chromebooks to help them produce a poster to share with others. We have also managed to fit in practises for sports day. Well done Whitebeam.

Oak

This week, Oak class have been rather excited by the news of the upcoming performance of Alice in Wonderland. We have spent some time researching props and set design, and even auditioned for different roles. In our writing, we created some instructions on how to make a solar-powered pizza oven, based on last week's activity. We have also applied our computing skills to our writing, by typing up and laying out our newspaper reports. We had a lovely afternoon on Monday and enjoyed some painting outside in the shade. In maths, we are now beginning to look at properties of shape.

This time of year, as we move into the last four weeks of the school year, is always a fantastic time. The children's end of year results start to come in, as well as their wider achievements becoming apparent, and notice and realise how much the children have grown since their photos at the beginning of the school year!
