

Parents and carers can áccess one-to-one support from a parenting coach - a trained family support worker - as well as advice and guidance articles across a range of common parenting challenges. Message from the Executive Headteacher....

Parents'/Carers' survey;

Thank you to everyone who filled this in, we really appreciate your feedback. The survey was very positive with some very lovely comments, so thank you. Suggestions made were that the older children could do with some more lunchtime equipment, which we fully agree with and are actioning. There was also a suggestion that it would be helpful to know more about what the children are learning, so we are going to use Class Dojo once a week to feedback

We also wanted to highlight our approach to poor behaviour. Most of our children behave absolutely superbly, but when a child needs additional support for their behavioural choices, we address this. We follow a process that is focused both on getting support for that child to improve the situation as swiftly as possible but also to ensure that other children are not adversely affected. Ultimately all our children are expected to follow our school rules and should the support not make a difference then we have to make difficult decisions. We know that sometimes the work we are doing is not visible externally and ask you to continue to raise any concerns to us. We want to reassure you that such difficulties cannot go on and on and do get resolved. We had a lovely Open Day this week; well done to our Head pupils who showed round our visitors - they were highly complimented!
