### Safeguarding....

Screen time

Technology has benefits, and some screen time can have positive impact in terms of being able to socialise with children from different areas, the interaction with computer games can develop hand-eye coordination and teamwork and creativity skills can be enhanced.

However too much screen time has negative impact as follows:

Sleep cycles are affected by blue light from screens, tricking our brain into thinking it is still daylight, making it difficult to sleep.

Too much passive screen time could weaken communication and social skills. Some research found that children who spent more than two hours a day on screen-time activities scored lower on language and thinking tests.

Screen-based entertainment increases central nervous system arousal, which can amplify anxiety.
Using devices while sitting in one place
