Important Safety Reminder

It has come to our attention this week that several children are using WhatsApp outside of school and there has been some uncomfortable moments for children reading and sending inappropriate messages to each other. WhatsApp allows users to send text, voice messages, video messages, make voice and video calls, and share images, documents, user locations and other content. To connect you with others, WhatsApp checks your phone's address book for other users and automatically suggests these as your WhatsApp contacts.

WhatsApp is rated 16+ years, so is well out of all of our children's age range.

This age limit was increased from 13 years and is there for a reason. The risks include experiencing cyber-bullying, unwanted contact, sexual exploitation, other criminal exploitation, risk of fraud, and access to inappropriate and explicit content. There are also features of WhatsApp that increase these risks.



Whatsapp; some questions

Whatsapp can be a great communication tool when used safely.

Did you know that Whatsapp age recomendation is now 16+?

Did you know that some messages etc disappear after they've been read?

Did you know your child can share their location with the group unknowingly?

Did you know that Whatsapp is encrypted, which means content is not monitored, meaning that your child can be exposed to harmful or inappropriate content...posted by other children.

National online safety day is coming up, so take this opportunity to look at your child's Whatsapp with them.

Message from the Executive Headteacher....

We have been made aware of some whatsapp groups that are causing problems for children and contain some very inappropriate content. The annual main Parents/Carers' survey will be with you soon; please do share your views as they help us shape our schools.

We are particularly aware that online safety is a tricky area for Parents/Carers; children now are growing up as digital natives and can be way more savvy than we are when it comes to tech!

We are asking a few questions in our questionnaire about this issue and will be arranging an evening meeting soon, so please watch out for that date.
