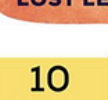



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Safeguarding.....

County Lines:

Criminals target vulnerable children, often by using other children to befriend them, and using them to hold, store and move drugs between counties.

Signs to watch out for include:

- persistent unexplained truancy -
- unexplained acquisition of money, clothes, shoes or mobile phone
- excessive receipt of texts or phone calls

- new relationships with older, controlling individuals
- leaving home or care without explanation

- suspicion of self-harm, physical assault or unexplained injuries

- parental concerns

- significant decline in performance in school

- significant change in emotional wellbeing

You may think that something like County lines wouldn't happen here or wouldn't affect your child, but it happened to one of our children some years ago, who was approached by someone they knew and asked to look after and sell a parcel. Luckily, the child was smart enough to tell both their Mum and school about it.
