If you say numbers randomly, can they find the number and colour it in? Do they notice any patterns? Where? What do they think would come next? Why? Which is their favourite number on the grid? Why? If they find it difficult to locate a number can you write it on a piece of paper/leaf etc and they then match it? Use a grid, a dice and some counters and see who gets to the end first!
Space, Shape & Measures	White Rose Maths - Day 2 Supertato https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/early-years/ Today the children are encouraged to think about whether the maths questions are correct or incorrect. You could write the questions out on card and your child sorts them into correct/incorrect. Can they tell you how they worked the answer out? What strategies did they use? If the answer is incorrect - what is the correct answer? For more of a challenge please write/ask questions using higher numbers, vocabulary such as double, half, 10 more, 10 less, shapes such as semi-circle, hexagon etc

	<p><u>My Garden</u> What is growing in your garden? Can you explore outside in your garden and discover what is growing there? How can you record what you see? Today I would like you to think about flowers. Do you have any flowers? Where are they? Did your family plant them? Are the flowers all the same colour? Size? How many different colours are there? Do you know the names of any flowers? Do your flowers smell? Can you find any of the flowers on the Plants and flowers hunt sheet?</p> <p>Can you draw a picture of your favourite flower? Could you label it using the vocabulary <i>petals, stem, leaves, roots</i></p> <p>Challenge: you might like to explore further and look at the life cycle of a plant</p>
