
All Things Were Made by Him

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
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Andy Goldsworthy Natural Sculptures



Andy Goldsworthy is a British sculptor, photographer and environmentalist. He lives in Scotland. He uses natural materials to make sculptures in sites in and around the UK. He has made them in forests, farms, fields, cities, mountains and more.



Sometimes they last for a long time, other times they last only days.
Can you make some natural sculptures like Andy Goldsworthy?



You could use: leaves, bark, sticks, mud, flowers, stones, feathers, sand, light, reflections and shadows. He often makes spirals, circles, swirls and arches.
