I have purchased Phonics Play for all of you to use as you wish. The username is 'Robin21' and the password is 'robins'.



Year 1 Maths

As a starter, recap addition up to 10 playing the Topmarks game:



OR

Practice adding using objects in your home, such as cereal, pasta, pencils, Lego bricks, shoes and hair bands! You can use absolutely anything in maths! Use these items to add two numbers together.

Complete the number sentences using the First, Then, Now layout. Here is an Example:

$$6 + 4 = ?$$

First, I started with 6 pieces of pasta.

Then, I added 4 more.

Now I have 10.

Answer: $6 + 4 = 10$

Questions:

1) $3 + 5 = \underline{\quad}$

2) $8 + 6 = \underline{\quad}$


3) $7 + 4 = \underline{\quad}$

4) $2 + 9 = \underline{\quad}$

5) $9 + 5 = \underline{\quad}$

	<p>Challenge: Make your own addition question using adding on</p> <p>Extension: Pick a number between 20 and 29 and add a number between 1 and 9.</p>
Handwriting	<p>Handwriting does not have to be practiced with a pencil, pen and paper. There are alternatives you can use such as flour, sand, mud, sticks, oats, brush and water.</p> <p>Can you practice the letter c?</p> <p>Write the letter, words and a sentence. Make sure you are making your tall letters tall, your long letters long and you are trying to keep your letters the right size. If your child struggles to form letters, practice writing in the air and carpet and show them how to write it first.</p> <p>Try writing:</p> <p>c clapped cat clever</p> <p>The clever cat clapped.</p> <p>Can you see the ending of this word makes it past tense?</p>
