# Reasoning and Problem Solving Step 5: Interpret Pictograms (2, 5 and 10)

Expected Use clues to complete the categories of a pictogram. One picture represents 2, 5 or 10 and there some half pictures.

Greater Depth Use clues to complete the categories of a pictogram. One picture represents 2, 5 or 10 and includes half pictures. Clues involve two steps.

Questions 3, 6 and 9 (Reasoning)

Developing Determine whether a statement about a pictogram is true or false and explain why. One picture represents 2, 5 or 10 and there are no half pictures. Statement involves simple retrieval.

Expected Determine whether a statement about a pictogram is true or false and explain why. One picture represents 2, 5 or 10 and there are some half pictures.

Greater Depth Determine whether a statement about a pictogram is true or false and explain why. One picture represents 2, 5 or 10 and includes half pictures. Statement involves two steps.

## Reasoning and Problem Solving Interpret Pictograms (2, 5 and 10)

#### **Developing**

1a. Anna is correct. Various answers, for example: There are more red balloons than any other colour.

2a. Lilies; Roses; Tulips

3a. True. Various answers, for example: If you count all the symbols in 5s the total is 70. There are 7 symbols for sheep and 7 x 5 = 35.

#### **Expected**

4a. Zara is incorrect. Various answers, for example: If you count the circles in 5s the total is 60. If you count the circles in 2s the total is 24, so the value of a circle is 2.

5a. Chess; Dance; Karate

6a. True. Various answers, for example: There are 9 full stars and half a star, which give a total value of 95, for both 'car' and 'train'. There are 9 stars for 'plane' which gives a total value of 90.

#### **Greater Depth**

7a. Ali is correct. Various answers, for example: For 'black' the total value is 40, for 'silver' it is 30 and for 'white' it is 20. 40, 30 and 20 are all multiples of 10 so the pictogram could be drawn with each button having a value of 10.

8a. Buses; Cars; Lorries; Value = 2 9a. False. Various answers, for example: Fred has 75 stickers and Amie has 40 so Fred has 35 more than Amie. Zac has 85 but Fred and Amie have 115 added together.

#### **Developing**

1b. Toby is incorrect. Various answers, for example: He has counted in 10s instead of 5s. There are 50 green pencils.

2b. Tom; Sam; Bess

3b. False. Various answers, for example: Josh planted 14 seeds but Freya planted 18 seeds so Freya planted the most. The symbols are worth 2 so Adam planted 4 seeds.

#### **Expected**

4b. Shadi is correct. Various answers, for example: If each square is worth 10, half a square is worth 5 so on Tuesday there were 10 + 10 + 10 + 5 = 35 school dinners.

5b. Red; Green; Blue

6b. False. Various answers, for example: There are 9 symbols for 'biscuits', which give a total value of 18 but there are 7 and a half symbols for 'cake', which give a total value of 15. There are 3 symbols for muffins, which give a total value of 6.

#### **Greater Depth**

7b. Saffie is incorrect. Various answers, for example: For 'red' the total value is 13, for 'blue' it is 16 and for 'green' it is 17. 13, 16 and 17 are not multiples of 5 so the pictogram could not be drawn with each marble having a value of 2.

8b. Hamsters; Rabbits; Mice; Value = 5 9b. True. Various answers, for example: 14 chose tuna and 7 chose beef. 14 is double 7. There are 4 and a half squares for ham so the total value is 9.
